ABOUT RAMKRISHNA MAHAVIDYALAYA

Being the second oldest higher educational institution in Tripura, Ramkrishna Mahavidyalaya was established on 1st September, 1950 under the aegis of the local Ramakrishna *Ashrama*. Unlike the Maharaja Bir Bikram College, Agartala there was no royal patronage behind this college. In those days Kailashahar was a small market town with a marginal literacy rate. But the igniting spirit of Shree Ramakrishna-Vivekananda ideology inspired some enlightened youths to initiate a project of higher education among the illiterate, undeveloped, economically backward local people. Most of those local people were *Bengalee* speaking along with a few Manipuri and the poor hill tribes who were basically *Jhum* cultivators. This extraordinary initiative of higher education adopted by the young ideologues of the locality became successful due to the whole-hearted cooperation of the local people.

Ramakrishna Mahavidyalaya bears the legacy of popular struggle and aspiration for higher education. The college was affiliated to the University of Calcutta and in 1987 it came under the Tripura University. In 1982, the college was undertaken by the Government of Tripura. In 1989 it got the affiliation of the University Grants Commission (UGC) under Section 12(B) and 2(F). In 2004, the college was assessed by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in its first cycle. In the year 2022 the NAAC assessed the college in its third cycle and accredited with 2.60 point or B+ grade. Its campus area is spread across 19.272 acres of land.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

Ramakrishna Mahavidyalaya is affiliated to Tripura University which offers degree on the basis of Tripura University NEP-2020 regulations under the Choice Based Credit System framed by Tripura University. An academic year is divided into two Semesters each of which is of six month duration. The duration of the UG programme is 4 years or 8 semesters. Students who desire to undergo a 3-year UG Programme will be allowed to exit after completion of the 3rd year with bachelor's degree and Bachelor's Degree with Honours/ Research will be awarded to a student after successful completion of four years (eight semesters). If a student wants to leave after the completion of the first or second year, the student will be awarded a UG Certificate or UG Diploma, respectively, provided he/ she secures the prescribed number of credits (as given in the NEP-2020 Regulations by Tripura University). Students who exit with a UG Certificate or UG Diploma are permitted to re-enter the programme within three years of exit and complete the degree programme. b) Students may be permitted to take a break(s) from the study, but the total duration for completing the Programme must not exceed seven years.

There will be eight Semesters in the degree programme which are classified as:

- ↳ Odd Semester (First , Third, Fifth and Seventh Semester)
- ↳ Even Semester (Second, Fourth, Sixth and Eighth Semester)
- ↳ Odd Semester duration is July- December every year and Even Semester duration is January-June.

In Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.) Programme:

Accountancy subject can be taken as major with other minor and interdisciplinary subjects as per Tripura University guidelines.

Apart from these mandatory Major/Minor/Interdisciplinary subjects in all the B.A./ B.Sc./ B.Com. Programmes, the students will also have Skill Enhancement Course/ Ability Enhancement Course/ Common Value Added Course/ Internship/ Vocational Course/ Dissertation/ Project/ Survey Work.

From the present academic year 2024-25, NSS subject will be introduced as a Value Added Course instead of NCC subject. NSS will have two parts, NSS I and NSS II and will be spread over two semesters to cover 1 year in all (i.e.4 credits in aggregate). NSS-II will be available only on completion of NSS I. Students will not be allowed to opt for NSS I in 4th semester.

AWARDING OF CERTIFICATE, DIPLOMA AND DEGREE:

UG Certificate: Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 40 credits will be awarded a UG certificate if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the first year. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

UG Diploma: Students who opt to exit after completion of the second year and have secured 80 credits will be awarded the UG diploma if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the second year. These students are allowed to re-enter within a period of three years and complete the degree programme within the maximum period of seven years.

3-year UG Degree: Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme will be awarded UG Degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 122 credits and satisfying the minimum credit requirement as per NEP-2020 Regulations by Tripura University.

4-year UG Degree (Honours): A four-year UG Honours degree in the major discipline will be awarded to those who complete a four-year degree programme with 162 credits and have satisfied the credit requirements as per NEP-2020 Regulations by Tripura University.

4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research): Students who secure 7.5 CGPA and above in the first six semesters and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. They should do a research project or dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of the University/College. The research project/dissertation will be in the major discipline. The students, who secure 162 credits, including 12 credits from a research project / dissertation, are awarded UG Degree Honours with Research.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE: As per the guidelines of the Tripura University, there are some procedures which have to be followed strictly:

A. Eligibility:

- i. A student who has passed Higher Secondary/H.S.(+2 stage)/Senior Secondary examination or equivalent from any recognized board/Council shall be eligible for admission to the 1st Semester of Under Graduate (B.A./B.Sc/B.Com/B.Music) programme subject to availability of seats. The students shall be taken into consideration for admission if he/she applied within five years from year of passing. The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating five years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.
- ii. For B.Sc. (Physical Science): A candidate who has passed 10+2 stage with Physics, Chemistry, and Mathematics shall be eligible for admission.
- iii. For B.Sc. (Biological Science): A candidate who has passed 10+2 stage with Physics, Chemistry and Biology shall be eligible for admission.
- iv. For B.Com. Programme: A candidate who has passed 10+2 with Commerce/Science will be eligible to take admission in B.Com.
- v. For B.A. Programme: A candidate who has passed 10+2 in any stream shall be eligible to take admission.

B. Selection Procedure:

- i. Major, Minor & Interdisciplinary subjects should not be same.
- ii. A student can apply for maximum five subjects as Major in a particular college. Major subject will be allotted strictly on the basis of merit.
- iii. Students will mention 4 subjects as Minor in order of preference (mentioning 4 subjects as Minor in the application is mandatory for students applying for Arts Programme).
- iv. Students will mention 4 subjects for Interdisciplinary Course in order of preference (mentioning 4 subjects as I in the application is mandatory for students applying for Arts Programme).
- v. The merit list will be prepared on the basis of sum of marks of Best Five subjects of H.S.(+2) Exam and the subject opted for Major.
 - a) If there is a tie in the sum, preference will be given on the marks obtained in the subject opted as Major (for breaking the tie).
 - b) If marks of the subject opted as Major is also equal, then the date of birth of the candidate will be considered. Senior will be given chance.
- vi. The merit list will be published for Major subject only.
- vii. Minor and interdisciplinary subject will be distributed among the students as per subject to availability of seat.

viii. Reservation policy of Government of Tripura will be followed.

C. Admission Restriction:

If a candidate takes admission in any college, he/she cannot take admission in any other college.

In case of admission in a second college, the admission in first college must be surrendered.

EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION:

A. End-Semester Examinations: The Controller of Examinations shall make necessary arrangement for notifying the dates of the End-Semester Examinations as per the Academic Calendar notified by the University.

B. Continuous Formative Evaluation/ Internal Assessment (IA): Total marks for each course shall be based on continuous assessments and semester end examination.

Total marks for each course = 100%

Continuous assessment (C1 + C2) = 40% marks

Semester End Examination (C3) = 60 % marks

C. Evaluation process of Internal Assessment marks shall be as follows:

i. The first component (C1) shall be based on test, assignment, seminar, case study, field work, project work etc. This assessment and score process should be completed after completing 50% of syllabus of the course/s and within 45 working days of semester program. ii. The second component (C2) shall be based on test, assignment, seminar, case study, field work, internship/ industrial practicum/ project work etc. This assessment and score process should be based on completion of remaining 50 percent of syllabus of the courses of the semester.

iii. During the 17th - 19th week of the semester, a semester end examination shall be conducted by the University for each Course. This forms the third 16 and final component of assessment (C3) and the maximum marks for the final component will be 60%.

iv. In case of a student who has failed to attend the C1 or C2 on a scheduled date, it shall be deemed that the student has dropped the test. However, in case of a student who could not take the test on scheduled date due to genuine reasons, such a candidate may appeal to the Program Coordinator/ Principal under intimation to the CoE, Tripura University. The Program Coordinator/ Principal in consultation with the concerned teacher shall decide about the genuineness of the case and decide to conduct special test to such candidate on the date fixed by the concerned teacher but before commencement of the concerned semester end examinations.

v. For assignments, tests, case study analysis etc., of C1 and C2, the students should bring their own answer scripts (A4 size), graph sheets etc., required for such tests/ assignments and these be stamped by the concerned department using their department seal at the time of conducting tests/ assignment/ work etc.

vi. The outline for continuous assessment activities for Component-I (C1) and Component-II (C2) of a course shall be as under.

* 5% marks for attendance shall be distributed as follows:

- a) 75% to less than 80% attendance - 1 Mark
- b) 80% to less than 85% attendance - 2 Mark
- c) 85% to less than 90% attendance - 3 Mark
- d) 90% to less than 95% attendance - 4 Mark
- e) 95% and above attendance - 5 Mark

* The marks of the internal assessment shall be published on the notice board of the department/ college for information of the students.

*A student may also be allowed to sit for any Semester Examination as a Non-Collegiate candidate, if he/she has attended minimum 65% of classes held in Theory and Practical separately in each Semester and on deposits of requisite amount of fees determined by the University from time to time. A student having attendance below 65% (65% Theoretical & 65% Practical classes) of the classes held in any Semester shall be declared as Dis-Collegiate and he/ she shall not be allowed to appear at the Semester-I/ Semester-II/ Semester-III/ Semester-IV/ Semester-V/ Semester-VI and Semester-VII/ Semester-VIII Examinations and shall have to be readmitted. No student will be allowed to appear in the End-Semester Examination of the University if he/ she fails to secure minimum 40% marks in the Internal Assessment portion.

D. University Semester End Results:

A. A student shall be declared as Passed in a course (Paper) in a Semester Examination, provided he/ she secure at least 40% marks separately in Internal Assessment and End Term Examination. Further provided that in case of Course (Paper) having Practical component a student shall have to secure 40% Marks separately in Theory and Practical component.

B. A student qualified to the next higher Semester with Back Paper(s) is considered eligible to appear at the higher Semester Examination provided he/ she fulfil all other conditions laid down in these Regulations. Such a student has to appear only in the Back Paper(s) of earlier Semester examination along with the appropriate Semester Examination (i.e. Odd to Odd and Even to Even).

C. If a student obtains F or Ab grade in any course(s), he/she will be treated as having failed in this/those course(s), He/she has to reappear in the examinations of that course(s) as and when conducted by the University, Marks obtained earlier in continuous assessment (Internal) may be carried forward and added to the marks obtained in repeat semester-end examination to decide the grade in the repeat course(s).

D. The student will be promoted to the next semester if he/she secures at least 50% of the total credits in a semester. In case the student secures less than 50% of the total credits in any semester, then the student will be declared fail in that semester and he/she will be asked to repeat the entire semester. In such cases the student will not be promoted to the next semester. However, pass marks secured by the student in any course (paper), in any semester will remain at his/her credit.

FACILITIES PROVIDED IN RAMKRISHNA MAHAVIDYALAYA:

The college provides different academic, co-curricular and other facilities to its students. Some of them are:

1. **Library:** The library of Ramkrishna Mahavidyalaya is very rich with lots of text and reference books. Reading Room facility for students and teachers is available. Library facilities are available for the Students as per the guidelines of the library.
2. **Stipend and Scholarship:** The college facilitates the students to avail the following types of stipend provided by the Government with direct benefit transfer are i) Merit stipend, ii) Girls' stipend, iii) SC,ST,OBC and Minority Stipend, iv) LIG stipend (for lower income group), v) Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Stipend, vi) Ishan Uday Scholarship by UGC.
3. **Placement Cell:** There is a placement Cell to provide access to the necessary information regarding the career options and placement for the students. The Cell organizes seminars, workshops and allied awareness programs etc. depending on the assistance provided by the college to create career consciousness among the students and even in collaboration with others Govt. Agencies and private sectors.
4. **Equal Opportunity Cell:** It is an another Cell that assures the question of equity in the academic and administrative affairs of the College. The Cell specially looks after the interests and security of the stakeholders belonging to the SC, ST, OBC, Religious Minority and Woman.
5. **IGNOU Study Centre:** Ramkrishna Mahavidyalaya has an IGNOU study centre in which different courses are offered. The courses offered here are: a) B.P.P.(Bachelor Preparatory Program), b) B.A, c) B.Com d) BCA, e) Other Diploma courses, f) MA in English , Political Science , History and Education etc.
6. **Students' Union Council:** The Student's Union Council of the College represents the views, opinion and aspirations of the students' community and gives the students a scope to expose their leadership skills. Throughout the year it takes part in different social and constructive activities.

- 7. Cultural Activities:** The cultural environment of the college is very encouraging. The Government cultural calendar is observed throughout the year with some other cultural programme.
- 8. Publication of College Magazine:** The yearly college magazine “SHREE” encourages the student’s writing skill and carries the signature of the budding poets and authors. Other than this there are some Wall Magazines which also play the same role.
- 9. Drinking Water and Sanitation Facility:** The college provides safe drinking water and sanitation facilities across the campus.
- 10. Games and Sports:** The facility for games and sports are available here. The Department of Physical Education plays a vital role in planning and designing of such activities. The college has its own sports field for various games and sports activities with indoor and outdoor GYM.
- 11. Separate Common Room for Girls:** There is a separate common room for the girls with some indoor game’s facilities.
- 12. Different Extension Activities of the College:** There are few extension wings of the college like a) NCC, b) NSS and Red Ribbon Club, c) Science Forum, d) Eco Club, etc. and students may associate themselves with different activities throughout the year.
- 13. Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell:** The College has an active anti-sexual harassment cell for the students and staffs.
- 14. Grievance Redressal Cell:** The College has an active Grievance Redressal Cell for the students.
- 15. SC/ST/OBC Cell:** The College has SC/ST/OBC cell for facilitate the SC/ST/OBC community students for their help in all sort of academic and other related activities.
- 16. Minority Cell:** The College has Minority cell for facilitate the minority (Muslim, Christian, Buddhist) community students for their help in all sort of academic and other related activities.
- 17. Blood Donation Cell:** The College facilitates the students as well as the society by donating blood to the needy persons through blood donation cell.
- 18. Soil Testing Centre:** The College runs Soil Testing centre with the help of Dept. of Geography for the students and society.
- 19. Students Hostel:** A hostel for the Girls students is there which can be availed by any girl student by following the prescribed procedure.
- 20. Computer Centre:** The College has one central computer centre where students as per their time-table perform their essential academic work.
